CCCS, Inc. Nexus Treatment Program 2013-2015



The Nexus Treatment Program posts an annual report of PREA investigations and outcomes.

As a requirement and at least on an annual basis, NEXUS Program management team including the director of Treatment Facilities and the PREA Coordinator from Corporate office will meet and review the staffing plan for adequate level of staffing and video monitoring to protect Family Members against sexual abuse and sexual harassment. The review includes the physical layout of the facility, population, substantiated and unsubstantiated incidents of sexual abuse and sexual harassment and any other relevant factors.

NEXUS Program Currently have 16 cameras and anticipate adding few more before the end of 2016.

Nexus Program staff receive annual training on PREA. Our training curriculum includes Transgender and Cross gender Pat Searches, various PREA power points from the PREA Resource Center web site, PREA policies review. Nexus Specialized services such as Mental Health, Medical and investigative staff have all received specialized PREA training from the NIC Website. Nexus Program has revised its PREA policies in 2015 and again in 2016 to meet and comply with all PREA Standards.

Nexus Program trains all contractors, volunteers and visitors on PREA as stated per PREA training policy.

NEXUS Program has scheduled its first PREA audit towards the end of July 2016.

The following are standardized definitions offered by the Prison Rape Elimination Act. This ensures everyone is using the same language, and has the same understandings of key terms.

Sexual abuse includes:

- (1) Sexual abuse of an inmate, detainee, or Family Member by another inmate, detainee, or resident; and
- (2) Sexual abuse of an inmate, detainee, or Family Member by a staff member, contractor, or volunteer.

Sexual abuse of an inmate, detainee, or Family Member by another inmate, detainee, or Family Member includes any

of the following acts, if the victim does not consent, is coerced into such act by overt or implied threats of violence, or is unable to consent or refuse:

- (1) Contact between the penis and the vulva or the penis and the anus, including penetration, however slight;
- (2) Contact between the mouth and the penis, vulva, or anus;
- (3) Penetration of the anal or genital opening of another person, however slight, by a hand, finger, object, or other instrument; and
- (4) Any other intentional touching, either directly or through the clothing, of the genitalia, anus, groin, breast, inner thigh, or the buttocks of another person, excluding contact incidental to a physical altercation.

Sexual abuse of an inmate, detainee, or Family Member by a staff member, contractor, or volunteer includes any of the following acts, with or without consent of the inmate, detainee, or resident:

- (1) Contact between the penis and the vulva or the penis and the anus, including penetration, however slight:
- (2) Contact between the mouth and the penis, vulva, or anus;
- (3) Contact between the mouth and any body part where the staff member, contractor, or volunteer has the intent to abuse, arouse, or gratify sexual desire;
- (4) Penetration of the anal or genital opening, however slight, by a hand, finger, object, or other instrument, that is unrelated to official duties or where the staff member, contractor, or volunteer has the intent to abuse, arouse, or gratify sexual desire;
- (5) Any other intentional contact, either directly or through the clothing, of or with the genitalia, anus, groin, breast, inner thigh, or the buttocks, that is unrelated to official duties or where the staff member, contractor, or volunteer has the intent to abuse, arouse, or gratify sexual desire;
- (6) Any attempt, threat, or request by a staff member, contractor, or volunteer to engage in the activities described above.
- (7) Any display by a staff member, contractor, or volunteer of his or her uncovered genitalia, buttocks, or breast in the presence of an inmate, detainee, or resident, and
- (8) Voyeurism by a staff member, contractor, or volunteer.

<u>Voyeurism</u> by a staff member, contractor, or volunteer means an invasion of privacy of an inmate, detainee, or Family Member by staff for reasons unrelated to official duties, such as peering at an inmate who is using a toilet in his or her cell to perform bodily functions; requiring an inmate to expose his or her buttocks, genitals, or breasts; or taking images of all or part of an inmate's naked body or of an inmate performing bodily functions.

Sexual harassment includes—

- (1) Repeated and unwelcome sexual advances, requests for sexual favors, or verbal comments, gestures, or actions of a derogatory or offensive sexual nature by one inmate, detainee, or Family Member directed toward another; and
- (2) Repeated verbal comments or gestures of a sexual nature to an inmate, detainee, or Family Member by a staff member, contractor, or volunteer, including demeaning references to gender, sexually suggestive or derogatory comments about body or clothing, or obscene language or gestures.

<u>Substantiated allegation</u> means an allegation that was investigated and determined to have occurred.

<u>Unfounded allegation</u> means an allegation that was investigated and determined not to have occurred.

<u>Unsubstantiated allegation</u> means an allegation that was investigated and the investigation produced insufficient evidence to make a final determination as to whether or not the event occurred.
