Warm Springs Addiction, Treatment and Change and Connections <u>Corrections West Program</u>

Annual Comparative Report

2019

The Warm Springs Addiction, Treatment and Change and the Connections Corrections West Program (WATCh-CCP West) posts an annual report of Prison Rape Elimination Act (PREA) investigations and outcomes.

The following are standardized definitions offered by the Prison Rape Elimination Act. This ensures everyone is using the same language, and has the same understandings of key terms.

Sexual abuse includes:

- (1) Sexual abuse of an inmate, detainee, or resident by another inmate, detainee, or resident; and
- (2) Sexual abuse of an inmate, detainee, or resident by a staff member, contractor, or volunteer.

Sexual abuse of an inmate, detainee, or resident by another inmate, detainee, or resident includes any

- of the following acts, if the victim does not consent, is coerced into such act by overt or implied threats of violence, or is unable to consent or refuse:
- (1) Contact between the penis and the vulva or the penis and the anus, including penetration, however slight;
- (2) Contact between the mouth and the penis, vulva, or anus;
- (3) Penetration of the anal or genital opening of another person, however slight, by a hand, finger, object, or other instrument; and
- (4) Any other intentional touching, either directly or through the clothing, of the genitalia, anus, groin, breast, inner thigh, or the buttocks of another person, excluding contact incidental to a physical altercation.

Sexual abuse of an inmate, detainee, or resident by a staff member, contractor, or volunteer includes any of the following acts, with or without consent of the inmate, detainee, or resident:

- (1) Contact between the penis and the vulva or the penis and the anus, including penetration, however slight;
- (2) Contact between the mouth and the penis, vulva, or anus;
- (3) Contact between the mouth and any body part where the staff member, contractor, or volunteer has the intent to abuse, arouse, or gratify sexual desire;
- (4) Penetration of the anal or genital opening, however slight, by a hand, finger, object, or other instrument, that is unrelated to official duties or where the staff member, contractor, or volunteer has the intent to abuse, arouse, or gratify sexual desire;
- (5) Any other intentional contact, either directly or through the clothing, of or with the genitalia, anus, groin, breast, inner thigh, or the buttocks, that is unrelated to official duties or where the staff member, contractor, or volunteer has the intent to abuse, arouse, or gratify sexual desire;
- (6) Any attempt, threat, or request by a staff member, contractor, or volunteer to engage in the activities described above.
- (7) Any display by a staff member, contractor, or volunteer of his or her uncovered genitalia, buttocks, or breast in the presence of an inmate, detainee, or resident, and (8) Voyeurism by a staff member, contractor, or volunteer.

Voyeurism by a staff member, contractor, or volunteer means an invasion of privacy of an inmate, detainee, or resident by staff for reasons unrelated to official duties, such as peering at an inmate who is using a toilet in his or her cell to perform bodily functions; requiring an inmate to expose his or her buttocks, genitals, or breasts; or taking images of all or part of an inmate's naked body or of an inmate performing bodily functions.

Sexual harassment includes—

- (1) Repeated and unwelcome sexual advances, requests for sexual favors, or verbal comments, gestures, or actions of a derogatory or offensive sexual nature by one inmate, detainee, or resident directed toward another; and
- (2) Repeated verbal comments or gestures of a sexual nature to an inmate, detainee, or resident by a staff member, contractor, or volunteer, including demeaning references to gender, sexually suggestive or derogatory comments about body or clothing, or obscene language or gestures.

<u>Substantiated allegation</u> means an allegation that was investigated and determined to have occurred.

<u>Unfounded allegation</u> means an allegation that was investigated and determined not to have occurred.

<u>Unsubstantiated allegation</u> means an allegation that was investigated and the investigation produced insufficient evidence to make a final determination as to whether or not the event occurred.

The WATCH-CCP WEST has compiled the following data regarding PREA reports, and subsequent PREA investigation results for the year of **2019**.

As a requirement and at least on an annual basis, the WATCh-CCP West management team including the Director of Treatment Facilities from Corporate Office will meet and review the staffing plan for adequate level of staffing and video monitoring to protect Family Members against sexual abuse and sexual harassment. The review includes the physical layout of the facility, population, substantiated and unsubstantiated incidents of sexual abuse and sexual harassment and any other relevant factors.

WATCh-CCP West currently has 28 cameras. The facility is looking into updating the camera system with the cooperation of DOC.

WATCh-CCP West staff receives annual training on PREA. Our training curriculum includes Cross-gender and Transgender Pat Searches, various PREA Power Points from the PREA Resource Center website, and PREA policies review. WATCh-CCP West's specialized services, such as Mental Health, Medical and investigative staff, have all received specialized PREA training from the NIC Website. Our Program has revised its PREA policies in 2019 to meet and comply with all PREA Standards.

The WATCh-CCP West Program trains all contractors, volunteers and visitors on PREA as stated per PREA training policy.

DATA COMPARISON:

While looking at the data from the previous year, it is evident staff along with family members are more educated about PREA. We have had an increase in reporting than previous years. WATCh-CCP West continues to take a proactive role in attempting to reduce sexual abuse and sexual harassment. We have implemented more PREA training to our staff and family members due to the increase of sexual harassment.

WATCh-CCP West continues to provide annual training and refresher courses throughout the year to keep staff aware and cognizant of their surroundings. Staff is trained and monitors their boundaries not only with other staff, but the family members as well. WATCh-CCP West maintains positive role modeling and reinforces a safe environment for all employees and family members.

The WATCh-CCP West Program had its first scheduled PREA audit April 15-17 2019. This audit was in compliance with all 36 standards. Ken Arnold, KEA Correctional Consulting LLC was the certified PREA Auditor from Castle Rock, CO.

The interim report was provided on May 28, 2019 to the WATCh/CCP West Program reporting <u>36</u> standards met and <u>03</u> exceeded standards.
